~~SECRET~~PART II: GENERAL CONCEPT OF OPERATIONS DURING THE REPORTING PERIOD

1st Battalion conducted aggressive patrolling within the TAOR and initiated a formidable program of night ambushes, saturating the area with ambushes throughout the hours of darkness. Due to the flooding of many areas as a result of the current heavy rainfall, the incidence of enemy contact lessened, as it was discovered that the rains had flooded many of their fighting and hiding holes. A show of force was made in the southern limits of the TAOR, utilizing tank-infantry-LVT task forces, while highly mobile platoon and squad forces roamed throughout the TAOR effectively interdicting VC control and influence. Concurrently with these operations, the I Corps Psychological Warfare Unit conducted operations and local patrols utilized face-to-face persuasion at all possible times in order to win the confidence of the people.

PART III. SEQUENTIAL LISTING OF SIGNIFICANT EVENTS

1. Personnel. Detailed personnel data is contained in the S-1 Journal submitted as a supporting document. One hundred fifteen USMC personnel were joined and 57 were dropped and/or transferred for a gain of 58. However, the average on board strength for USMC officers during the month dropped from last month's average of 35 to an average of 33. The Battalion sustained 30 WIA's and three KIA's.

2. Administration. Nothing significant.

3. Intelligence. Information was received early in the month which indicated Viet Cong intentions to strike the Marble Mountain Air Facility sometime during the period 20-28 November. The Viet Cong build-up was carefully plotted throughout the period 1-17 November.

An operation was undertaken to strike the Viet Cong in grid squares (BT 1064), (BT 1164), (BT 1063), and (BT 1163) (See S-3 Journal). It is now assumed that as a result of this operation, the Viet Cong were forced to change their plans, they withdrew at least six companies. This withdrawal was completed by about 22 November. Part of the forces went west to approximately (AT 5880) and the remainder went to (BT 1359).

For the remainder of the period of the month, enemy activities were chiefly concerned with harassment activities i.e., sniping and mining.

a. Psychological Warfare. PsyWar conducted during the month of November included the following:

(1) The I Corps 1st Psy-Ops Field Detachment (Prov) Audio Team conducted operations through the use of tape news broadcasts (including local news), newsreels, propaganda movies, cartoons, speeches from local officials and distribution of leaflets and magazines to the hamlets within the Battalion TAOR. The general theme concerned supporting the GVN with objectives of (1) creating, building, and maintaining confidence in the GVN; (2) to establish a climate of national unity behind the war effort, (3) to expose the true nature of the NLF/VN objectives, and (4) to insure that the people of Vietnam are aware that allied forces are here at the request of the GVN and that they will depart when peace is restored.

(2) 1st MAW Psychological Warfare Loudspeaker Helicopter was not utilized due to non-availability.

(3) The HOA VANG District Political Action Propaganda Team was not utilized due to their operating solely in support of People's Action Teams activities in the pacification area (3/9 TAOR).

3. Special Operations. None.

c. Employment of AN/TPS-21, SID/150, and the Infrared Sighting Device

(1) AN/TPS-21. The Battalion's two AN/TPS-21's have been in a down status for the reporting period. One set was destroyed in an LVT which struck a mine on 23 October, and the second set has the amplifier detector power supply and frequency converter transmitter in FLSG. One set was borrowed from Regiment and has been used for approximately six days overlooking the MSR and the eastern sector of the TAOR, however, with negative results.

(2) SID/150. The Battalion was issued 20 additional SID's during November that brings our total to 21 in the Battalion. Five are being utilized on the Marble Mountain Airfield perimeter, 11 are being utilized by the forward companies on the NLL, and five are being utilized on the Battalion Command Post perimeter. Company "A" picked up two Viet Cong on 25 November when they came within three meters of a "head" at coordinates (BT 092667).

(3) Infrared Sighting Device. Out of 16 scopes, nine are being utilized by the forward companies in ambush/patrol activities and seven have been down for lack of parts. There were no contacts with these scopes for the period.

4. Training. All companies received training from the engineers attached to this Battalion in mine warfare, and all unit leaders down to squad level are now proficient in the installation and necessary safety procedures of Claymore mines and small charges. Periods of instruction were also held for all companies in the nomenclature, functioning, and employment of the M-72 Rocket Launcher (LA7) and this weapon is now in use with the rifle companies of the Battalion. Required training was also conducted in the care and handling of POW's, moral guidance, and personal hygiene.

5. Special Operations. On 19 November 1965 a Battalion operation was conducted in the southern area of the TAOR utilizing a combined infantry-tank-LVT team with all available supporting arms. This operation resulted in five VC KIA, and details of the operation are to be found in After Action Report No. 5-65, which is included as a supporting document to this Command Chronology.

6. Nuclear, Biological, Chemical, and other Special Types of Warfare. Nothing significant.

7. Command and Control. Nothing significant.

8. Communications-Electronics. The Communications Platoon continued to support the Battalion in its mission within the TAOR.

The AN/PRC-25 was introduced with outstanding results in range, maintenance, and battery life. There was no breakdown in communications during the only Battalion size operation of this reporting period due to its use.

A radio operator and a wireman from the Communications Platoon were assigned to each rifle company on a permanent basis to assist the communications effort in the rifle companies.

An area defense radio net was established for use by all U. S. units in the DA NANG EAST complex with 1/9 net control station.

Maintenance support improved considerably during the period, however, logistical support remained poor, especially in the area of dry cell batteries.

9. Close Combat. Due to the recent heavy rains and subsequent flooding of much of the TAOR, contact with the VC diminished over previous months, although an ambitious program of patrols and ambushes was conducted. Even with the diminished VC activity within the TAOR, operations resulted in 16 VC KIA and the capture of 20 confirmed VC.

10. Fire Support and Fire Support Coordination. Nothing significant.

11. Logistics

a. Division Ordnance Inspection Team. During the period 4-6 November the Division Ordnance Inspection team inspected nearly all crew-served weapons of this organization. This included those in forward areas. The inspection party indicated our ordnance was satisfactory with minor discrepancies.

b. Introduction of Rocket, 66mm HEAT with Launcher, M-72 Light Antitank Weapon (LAW). On 15 November the M-72 (LAW) was issued to this Battalion. To date none have been used in combat, however all companies have received training in the employment, characteristics, and functioning. A basic allowance of 18 per rifle company has been established and those companies which have received the required instruction on this weapon have been issued their basic allowance.

c. Cantonment Program. This Battalion's cantonment program is approximately 85% complete. An outside storage building with a 900 square foot storage capacity has been constructed at Battalion Supply.

d. Trafficability. Trafficability in this Battalion's TAOR continued to be satisfactory despite the monsoon rains. Good trafficability on and off established roads is directly attributable to the sandy soil in this area. Little construction or engineering effort was required to keep the roads in a passable condition.

e. Deadline of Motor Transport Equipment. Deadline motor transport equipment reached an all time high for this organization during the month of November. On 30 November there were 14 M274's and eight M22's at FLSG awaiting engines. The remaining 1422's are on deadline awaiting parts.

12. Air Defense. Nothing significant.
13. Combat Air Support. Nothing significant.
14. Medical and Dental Support. On 3 November civilian sick call in HOA LONG temporarily postponed because of attitude of people (frightened, would not come to sick call allegedly because VC told them not to).

During the period 7-14 November the Battalion experienced a mild epidemic of bacillary dysentery.

On 15 November sick call in HOA LONG resumed.

During the period 17-20 November the Battalion medical personnel assisted in control of the civilian cholera epidemic.

On 23 November a "ward" tent was set up as holding facility.

On 24 November the Battalion began tri-weekly sick calls in surrounding hamlets with Army Psychological Warfare Team.

Throughout the month the Battalion medical personnel treated several slightly to moderately injured battle casualties plus many Vietnamese with gun shot wounds, etc.

15. Chaplain Support. During November regular worship services, both Catholic and Protestant, were held in the Battalion Chapel. A special Thanksgiving Service was also held on 25 November in the Chapel. Company "A" was visited in the field on Thanksgiving where a Protestant Communion service and a Catholic Mass were held.

The Chaplain delivered hundreds of letters, Christmas cards, and packages to all hands from "Operation Mail Call" with excellent response from the troops. Several of these letters were selected and answered by the Chaplain.

Counseling on personal problems has been given to eight men of the Battalion. Church parties left the Battalion area for Jewish, Latter Day Saint, and Christian Science Church services.

Visits were made to make friends of the Buddhist monks of Marble Mountain. Twenty-eight dolls were presented to HAI AN Protestant Church for their work with the refugees. A scholarship to Hue Teachers College was presented to KIEU THI MINH TRYET to be administered by Christian Missionary Alliance in DA NANG.

Moral guidance lectures were given by the Chaplain to 36 men of H&S Company and 48 men of Company "B".

16. Civil Affairs. During the month of November the Battalion concentrated its civic action effort in the area of HOA LONG Village. MedCap treatment was given three times weekly in the hamlet of NUI KIM SON (BT 073704). On 19 November the Battalion Surgeon discovered cholera in the village. The disease was quickly controlled and eliminated.

Each company in the field gave medical assistance to local civilians. Clothing and soap were distributed to needy villagers.

The Chief of HOA HAI Village and his family are living within the Battalion CP perimeter.
